While sale barns were shut down for the holiday season, fat cattle prices continued to improve through last week. Demand has remained strong for beef and choice and select cuts are now over \$200 again. All of this is happening while we are slaughtering over 5% more cattle with wholesale beef and retail beef in strong demand. Beef exports have been gaining ground and we are finally closing in on the 5 year average. All signs are pointing to a better market with stronger support. Today's market picked up right where we left off in 2016. The packer market is still struggling to gain ground with packer cows and bulls still moving in big numbers.
