To compound problems, the stocker guys are starting to run into health issues with their calves from the cool nights and warm days which in turn is effecting their eagerness to buy more calves to put on top of their sick ones. This is more of a seasonal problem we face each year and is generally relatively short lived. We are seeing a pretty severe discount on plainer calves as well as bull calves compared to steer calves. It is a good idea to work your calves in this market if at all possible. Let us know if there is something we could help you out with. Early consignments for next week's cattle sale include 50 calves off of one ranch.
