Today's market was steady to \$5 higher on feeders and stocker calves, while \$2 lower on packer cows and bulls. A good rain should help the stocker market as people will soon be able to graze their small grains with the unseasonably warm October. Fat cattle coming out of the feedlots again sold higher than last week with a heavy volume of transactions. Show lists are smaller this week which should give feedlots the bargaining tool to at least hold the market steady this week. The market is showing signs of being driven by market fundamentals instead of technical indicators which should make it easier to correct itself. We have several ranches that are bringing calves in spread out over the next month, some of these calves will be weaned and some of them will not.
