COMMENTS:

We had several good sets of calves today on a very active market that sold sharply higher. Calves sold mostly \$5 higher with weaned calves and replacement type heifers selling for an additional \$5-\$10 premium. Fat cattle coming out of the feedlots were able to hold firm and sold mostly at \$105 last week, even with processing plants moving cattle at almost full capacity. Show lists will be smaller this week with the Thanksgiving holiday coming up which should give feeders more bargaining power to advance cattle at a higher price.

We will NOT have a cattle sale next week due to the Thanksgiving holiday. Our next cattle sale will be Tuesday, Nov. 29th. We should have 100+ weaned calves selling off of a couple ranches, mainly 600#-700# choice steers and heifers. Before the sale, we are having a seminar that starts at 10:30 on the new Veterinary Feed Directive that will go into effect in 2017. This will be followed by a customer appreciation steak lunch at 11:30, followed up with our cattle sale. Everyone is invited and we hope to see you all here!
