COMMENTS:

We sold cattle today on a mostly steady market with some classes of heifers selling better than \$10 higher. Packer cows and bulls also sold on a steady market on a light run. The overall cattle market has rebounded after January's Cattle on Feed Report and looks to remain steady for the short term future. This market seems to be driven more by fundamentals and is going to follow the live cattle market as the fats come out of the feed yard. Boxed beef prices are holding their own, even after last week's kill of 580K + compare to last year's kill of 547K the same week. The competition the beef industry gets from the pork and poultry industries will be the next hurdle as we approach Spring.
