The cattle we marketed today sold again on a strong market with firm demand on all classes of cattle. The entire cattle industry has been supported by higher prices for the last several weeks with excellent demand from the cow/calf operator through the retailer. The Brazil meat scandal gave the industry a little boost last week as several countries either pulled out or at least added restrictions on their meat imports from Brazil. The U.S. stands to gain ground in some much needed beef exports to some of those countries, but any added benefits to exports will not be seen for at least 30 days. While prices have continued to rise with fat cattle coming out of the nation's feedlots, the volume being moved has been somewhat disappointing the last couple of weeks. This might suggest this market has just about peaked out as show lists will continue to get larger going forward.
