COMMENTS:

In a matter of three weeks, the cattle industry has seen the cash market on cattle coming out of the feedlot drop from nearly \$140/CWT to the low \$120s/CWT this past week. This, in turn, has soured the market all the way down to the cow/calf producer as the market searches for a bottom. The futures market posted good gains on Monday, but was having trouble sustaining any gains on Tuesday. Through all of this, beef demand has been better than most have anticipated which should put a floor on this market from getting much cheaper. Cattle sold very well today on a steady to \$5 stronger market in some cases. Keep in mind we will NOT have a sale next week because of Independence Day, but look forward to seeing you all on July 11th!
