There was little difference in the price today on stocker/feeder calves compared to last week's market. Packer cows and bulls, however, were cheaper due to the number of cows and bulls going to slaughter as people are culling as the grass gets shorter. The calf market is still up in the air as to any direction it might be heading. New show lists are getting smaller each week, but cutouts keep closing lower with a heavy supply in cold storage. It may be some time yet before prices turn back around. It will probably take much longer for the market to truly correct itself.
