Comments:

Today's market featured some really nice sets of calves that sold very well despite the recent falloff in the futures market. We sold one group of 22 head of weaned steers that weighed 775# for \$141.50/CWT. We also sold some steers weighing a little over 400# for \$187.50/CWT. Packer cows and bulls were a little softer, but still strong. Seasonally, the prices typically fall off some in September and October mainly due to the increased health risk the buyers experience when trying to straighten out calves that haven't been weaned or preconditioned. With that being said, any calves you have ready for market might need to be sold in the near future.
