Today's market was strong on several good sets of cattle resulting in a market that was \$5-\$10 higher. After another good week with the futures market, there seems to be a more bullish attitude following through to the calf market. Boxed beef sales were once again larger while still advancing as much as \$1.60. This reflects confidence in demand through the third quarter of this year. Keep in mind that historically prices seem to slip some in September/October on calves that are not weaned. The next two to three weeks may be a good time to market your calves with us!
