The market remains strong on all classes of #1 cattle. Lightweight calves have met a little resistance as expected with this hot and dry weather and may soften up a little until the weather pattern changes. Tighter numbers on heavier cattle should hold the market going forward in the short term. Any weighing cows might need to be marketed sooner rather than later in case we see another wave of cows coming due to no water and depleted range conditions.
